


Youth and Education Services

Service Highlights

"Lightness" Life Education Project

"Y-Concept" and "Fung Ching Drama Theatre", both operating under Jockey Club Youth Leap, worked together to organise the "Lightness Life Education Project" – a programme in which teenagers who once had suicidal thoughts are invited to share their experiences with young musicians and scriptwriters. Through music, scriptwriting and performance, they reinterpret past experiences, inject positive thinking, and strengthen resilience.

One of the participating bands, "Lap Chau", composed the song for one of the teenagers. The song described this teenager's stress due to her academic results and relationship issues. Due to this overwhelming stress, she tried to commit suicide twice and was fortunately saved. Therefore, she would like to use her own story to encourage others who are feeling depressed. Apart from a release event held for the music video, the band also visited three secondary schools to share messages with the students via music videos, encouraging them to understand and come to terms with their emotions and cherish their lives. Up to 420 students attended the talks.

Highlights of the "Lightness Life Education Project"

Fung Ching Theatre

Jockey Club Youth Leap presented several different performances in 2022. With a subsidy from the Home Affairs Department, the theatre's musical debut "Aftertaste" was a great success. Fifty teenagers were recruited for the musical, and they worked together as actors, backstage personnel, scriptwriters and directors. The four performances attracted audiences of over 1,000 people. Light-hearted and satirical, the storyline of "Aftertaste" aims to encourage young people to reflect on their family relationships and highlights the importance of the family. The positive feedback from the audience affirmed the participants' efforts in the production process, which helped to enhance their self-confidence.


Joint-School Parent-Child Sports Day 2023

Our Joint-School Parent-Child Sports Day was held again this year after a three-year hiatus. A total of 616 children and their parents from three kindergartens gathered early in the morning at Kowloon Tsai Sports Ground in full spirit. After some warm-up exercises, they participated in six large-scale competitive sports games that involved running, jumping, climbing and crawling. Both parents and children enjoyed the games a lot. We were also pleased to invite our school supervisor and Board members to kick off the ceremony and interact with the parents and students.



The Agency held the inter-school parent-child sports event again, with more than 600 children and parents from three kindergartens gathering at the Kowloon Tsai Sports Ground for the competition.

Playful Community League @Kwun Tong

Since 2022, Jockey Club Youth Leap has collaborated with the Playright Children's Play Association to organise a regular Playful Community League at Jockey Club Shun Tin Youth Leap, while "League Ambassadors" were also trained at various open spaces in Shun Tin Estate. The League attracted a total of 300 participants, where children could express their innovative ideas to create their own game spaces in which they could enjoy free play. Parents were also invited to be volunteer for the games, during which they were encouraged to understand more about their children in order to enhance parent-child interactions.

Dream Sailor

The "Dream Sailor" project encompasses multiple activities and training sessions and is designed to support students with Special Educational Needs in their career planning. Serving four schools with around 70 students and their parents, the project utilises a narrative therapy framework that helps the students cultivate a new self-identity, intending to broaden the career development horizons of the students and their parents, while enhancing the confidence in their abilities and nurturing their hopes for developing a future successful career.
