

Highlights of the Year

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2024 • April

Our Agency secured the contract for operating Sheung Kin House, a Supported Hostel located in LOHAS Park, Tseung Kwan O. The hostel commenced its service in 2025, providing 31 residential places for people with disabilities. Through collaborations among multi-disciplinary teams, the service incorporates unique local characteristics while leveraging the synergy created with other regional services to build family connections and encourage community participation through technology, sports and art. We also apply a strength-based approach and the International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) to help people with disabilities maximise their potential, promote inter-sector collaborations and build an inclusive society.



April



With a renewed funding of HK\$4.27 million from the HKEX Foundation, a three-year rehabilitation transitional project named “Walking Along with You – Post-discharged Support and Community Day-care Rehabilitation Programme” was launched by Lively Elderly Day Training Centre in April 2024. The programme aims to provide suitable day care and rehabilitation services for elderly patients who have been discharged from hospital after suffering from stroke or fracture from fall, benefitting 638 families in its first year of operation.

August

The “GREEN@COMMUNITY” initiative is making strides, with the government establishing “Recycling Stores” in nearly 50 public housing estates since 2024. CFSC was awarded various service contracts by the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) to operate “GREEN@KAI YIP” and “GREEN@SHUN LEE” in Kwun Tong District, as well as “GREEN@TSZ CHING”, “GREEN@TSZ MAN” and “GREEN@TSZ LOK” in Wong Tai Sin District.

The grand opening for the three Recycling Stores in Wong Tai Sin took place in August 2024, with Miss Bonnie Ho Wing-tung, Assistant District Officer (Wong Tai Sin) of the Home Affairs Department, Mr. Chen Che-kong, Head of Community Recycling Network of EPD and Ms. Ivy Leung Siu-ling, Chief Executive of CFSC, as the officiating guests. Several district councillors also recorded video messages to extend their congratulations and encourage local residents to embrace sustainable living.



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October

In October 2024, the Integrated Home Care Services (Ordinary Cases) and the Home Care and Support Services for Elderly Persons with Mild Impairment have been consolidated into Home Support Services. CFSC's Home Support Services aim to provide home-based community care and support for elderly individuals with mild impairment, people with disabilities, and other individuals and families in need, with 274 service quotas in Wong Tai Sin District and 828 in Kwun Tong District.



October

To uphold the concept of “whole-person health” and strengthen public awareness of primary healthcare services, our Primary Health Care Services hosted the “Symposium on Person-centered Integrated Care in Primary Healthcare” on 31st October 2024. Experts from mainland China, Singapore and Hong Kong were invited to share their valuable insights and practical experience in integrated person-centred care, while exploring how healthcare systems could be more responsive to the holistic needs of individuals through collaborations and inclusive practices. This landmark event brought together nearly 200 professionals from the healthcare and social welfare sectors, fostering meaningful dialogue on the advancement of integrated care models across Asia.



2025 • March

To promote the development of the “Empowerment in Care Model” in Hong Kong, the city's first “Empowerment in Care Experiential Day and Restraint Reduction Charter Kick-off Ceremony” was inaugurated on 22nd March 2025. The event, organised by the Silver Development Foundation and co-organised by CFSC and the Elderly Services Association of Hong Kong, engaged more than 110 practitioners in elderly care services and members of the Legislative Council. A total of 300 residential care homes for the elderly and care service providers signed the Restraint Reduction Charter, demonstrating a collective effort to address the challenges of an ageing society and improving the service quality for elderly care.



March

As an early supporter of the Pilot Project on Integrated Community Rehabilitation Centre (ICRC), we have provided centre-and home-based services to over 180 people with disabilities over the past two years. These services include personal and nursing care, therapeutic training, psychological counselling, resource referrals, transportation and escort support for medical appointments. As the service transitions into a permanent programme, we will work closely with the Social Welfare Department to improve our service quality and continue to support the everyday needs of people with disabilities and their carers by adopting a hybrid model of centre-and home-based support, combined with the ICF framework and innovative rehabilitation technology. Our goal is to improve the well-being of people with disabilities through more comprehensive and better-quality support services.
