#### Inclusive Carnival and Charity Dinner

CFSC joined forces with LoveXpress – a charitable organisation, as well as several local partner groups, to organise the "Sham Shui Po under the Starry Sky" Inclusive Carnival and Charity Dinner on 26<sup>th</sup> October 2024. Through a variety of cultural performances, the event aimed to foster the public's appreciation of Sham Shui Po's rich historical and cultural heritage. The Charity Dinner welcomed more than 600 participants, including low-income residents and families with special educational needs across the district, fostering a sense of a caring and inclusive community.

Sponsored by the Sham Shui Po District Social Welfare Office's “Platform for Strengthening Support to Persons with Disabilities in SSP”, the Agency hosted an Inclusive Open Day: “Sham” Tour on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2024. The event featured activities ranging from service demonstrations to interactive games and a card-writing station, designed to foster meaningful interactions and exchanges within the social service sector, while educating carers and community members on the local resources and support services available to them. The atmosphere was vibrant and welcoming, with enthusiastic participation and positive feedback from peers, carers, community stakeholders, and residents. The event was successful in putting inclusion into action, as participants gained a deeper understanding of our services and community resources.

To showcase their artworks to the broader community, we established a new exhibition space at our headquarters called “C+ Arts” and invited renowned Hong Kong calligrapher Wah Gor to give a live demonstration at the opening ceremony, during which he wrote the name of the venue in Chinese calligraphy to inspire and encourage inclusive artists.

The two-day event was jointly organised by Cheerful Place – District Support Centre (Kwun Tong East), Shun On District Elderly Community Centre, Everjoy – Home Care Service for Persons with Severe Disabilities, Integrated Community Rehabilitation Centre (Kowloon East) and the Professional Outreaching Team for Private Residential Care Homes for Persons with Disabilities (Team 4). Through a variety of hands-on activities and interactive game stalls, the event provided opportunities for community members to interact and connect with one another. We were honoured to have Mr. Stephen Ng Kwong-lam, Captain of the On Lee Sub-district Care Team, and Mr. Tsang Wing-fai, District Councillor, officiated on the two days of the event. During the event, more than 300 participants, including service users, volunteers, teachers and students, explored the engaging world of emerging and gerontechnology-assisted sports through hands-on experiences and interactive game stalls. The event helped to foster meaningful interactions between our service users and other community stakeholders, building a strong network of community collaboration.

“Seeing Ability through Coffee” is a programme designed to introduce service users to the world of coffee-making and equip them with the knowledge and skills necessary to become qualified inclusive baristas through a series of catering and community volunteering training sessions. Among the 53 participants who have joined the programme, six have earned internationally-recognised certification from the COFFEE Lover International Barista School. To celebrate this encouraging news and our 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we held the “Seeing Ability through Coffee” Graduation Ceremony and Opening Ceremony of PopUp Café. PopUp Café is a community-based mobile coffee service run by our graduate baristas, and it has already organised 32 inclusive events with corporate partners including ICBC (Asia), OCBC Bank Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Trade Development Council, serving over 3,000 people.
