the Christian Family Service Centre (CFSC) was established in 1954.

It was initially named as the 'United Presbyterian Casework

Centre'

targeted at providing services to the needy with financial

difficulties.

It was until 1965 that the Centre was renamed as CFSC

and was relocated to its current address at 3 Tsui Ping Road, Kwun

Tong.

With the increasing demand for social services

the Board of Directors has decided

to rebuild a headquarters building with ten storey in 1987.

The construction completed in 1998

and has embraced a brand new page to the development of the

Centre.

As the second millennium approaches

the government has been actively promoting

the reform of various social welfare funding systems.

In 2001, the Centre has officially joined

the Lump Sum Grant Subvention System

by the Social Welfare Department.

As the Centre develops and demand for social needs rises

the Centre launches a series of service reforms

enabling increased efficiency in service work logistics

as well as improving quality of work

we see improvements and changes in their relationship.

for giving me the care and support I needed when I was lost.

Because of my personal experience

I was motivated to becoming a social worker

to help those in need

to influence a life with my life and to become a companion

in their journeys of life so as to show support.

Ms Wong: I was deeply touched when she told me that

she would want to be a social worker because of me Initially I only hoped to help mend her relationship

with her family regardless of the outcome.

Unexpectedly, my companion with her has an influence

on her dream to becoming a social worker

and even to help those in need.

I was really grateful and appreciative when I heard what she said.

And I do hope that she can put what she has experienced

into helping the others

and to serve those who are in need.

A physiotherapist from the hospital said to me

"I can recommend you to a centre in Kwun Tong if you do not

mind."

When the Centre called, my wife sent me to the car and then went to the Centre for physical exercise.

I do not mind the physical fatigue

after exercising for a year

I ask her if there is anything I can help

with whenever she is busy

Mrs Cheng: He met a lot of friends who share similar experiences

after coming to the Centre

he became more talkative and cheerful than before.

Mr Cheng: The Centre has helped us a lot

in turn I helped my wife to lessen her burdens.

I am happy when I see her happy

Ms Lau: When he first came to our Centre for assessment

his physical coordination was not too good his sudden change from being the "stronger"

who used to help others

into a person who needs help from his wife in various areas

has made him down and upset

Seeing his improvements has given our team

a very positive encouragement

Other than his physical improvements

our previous counseling sessions have also helped Mr Cheng

and his wife to restore their confidence

to continue his road of recovery

This is one of our largest achievements

VO: In 2008, CFSC has established its Project Development Team

focusing on the development of sustainable

and innovative service plans

so as to bid and open up new service lines

At the same time

CFSC embedded new elements on top of the existing services to make amendments in order to facilitate the society's needs

as well as enhancing CFSC's ability

of helping one self while serving others

Mr Kwok: Looking upon the future

It is estimated that that the society will continue to evolve

and that the public's expectation to the standards and effects of social services will be tightened
